About Us

A critical component to the success of all newborn screening systems is ensuring that all families and providers supporting families have access to reliable, accurate and relevant newborn screening information. As the number and complexity of conditions included in newborn screening panels expands, access to diagnostic and preventive services and the dissemination of reputable information is critical. Engaging individuals with or those who are at-risk of developing these conditions, as well as their families and support teams in the newborn screening system is necessary to improve the overall system of care for families.

In 2023, The Newborn Screening Technical Assistance and Evaluation Program (NewSTEPs) established the Newborn Screening Follow-Up and Education Subcommittee. Nested under this new Subcommittee is the Education Workgroup, co-developed with Expecting Health. This workgroup provides expertise and input on education in support of NewSTEPs activities and provides additional technical support to ensure that all families have equitable access to newborn screening information and have confidence to participate in the newborn screening system.
